W Grade Policy

The Commission's recommendations to the Academic Policy Committee for further review are:

- 1. Due to the variableness of hours between courses, stipulate a number of courses that the policy can be applied to rather than a number of hours. The Commission recommends three courses.
- 2. To be able to utilize the policy retroactively. It was suggested to require a deadline.
- 3. Do not stipulate a grade requirement in order to take advantage of the policy.
