New Dean of Students, Mark Sikes, was introduced and asked the commission to introduce themselves to him.

3. New Business

First Reading: CGPSA 2022-23A (Resolution to Expand Access to Reproductive Care at Virginia Tech)

*Some questions asked by members:

**Does student health insurance cover this? No

**Has Schiffert given a reason why they do not offer these services? Not all reasons are known, but one concern is what happens if there are side effects and Schiffert is not open.

**How can we ensure that all VT campuses can be served by this resolution? Roanoke has closer access than NVC. Some clinics in Roanoke are coordinating with Schiffert.

*Schiffert now offers non-hormonal IUDs since the resolution was written.

*A member suggested expanding on what already exists. Dean Learman suggested to list all services that access should include, even if some are currently provided:

WPSI recommends that adolescent and adult women have access to the full range of contraceptives and contraceptive care to prevent unintended pregnancies and improve birth outcomes. Contraceptive care includes screening, education, counseling, and provision of contraceptives (including in the immediate postpartum period).**** Contraceptive care also includes follow-up care (e.g., management, evaluation and changes, including the removal, continuation, and discontinuation of contraceptives).

WPSI recommends that the full range of U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA)- approved, -granted, or -cleared contraceptives, effective family planning practices, and sterilization procedures be available as part of contraceptive care.

The full range of contraceptives includes those currently listed in the FDA's Birth Control Guide*****: (1) sterilization surgery for women, (2) implantable rods, (3) copper intrauterine devices, (4) intrauterine devices with progestin (all durations and doses), (5) injectable contraception.

*After discussion, an amendment to include the above and more was decided on. It will go to GPSS and then back to this commission.
