Dean Surprenant discussed that sometimes there are too many levels (work gets split and can be watered down). Quorum has not yet been met this semester in CGPSA/Who does what? Need to fill positions/ Regarding detailed questions, there is often a level of confusion on specifics/ The importance of serving could be clarified/ There are concerns about duplications of programs and the process of getting programs or courses approved. The hope is that Courseleaf will help with this.
- b. How well are the approval path of a resolution and timeline understood? How might this be streamlined? A flowchart makes it straightforward. Dean Surprenant said you don't want it too streamlined so things don't go through too quickly. Streamlining may be interpreted as a way to reduce shared governance. Adding notifications may be helpful.
- c. Are any important constituencies missing from membership on your commission/senate? If so, which one(s)? No
- d. One of the goals of the new governance structure was to reduce the size of University Council and balance representation on University Council more appropriately. Would you recommend any changes? No
- e. Has it been difficult to fill the positions on your commission/senate? If so, what do you think is the reason(s)? Have not articulated issues discussed. No clarity on who is taking the lead. CGPSA? CGPSP? Better attendance is needed. Member suggested only meeting once a month.
