Commission on Administrative and Professional Faculty Affairs Resolution CAPFA 2022-23B

Resolution to Revise Chapter 7, Section 7, of the Faculty Handbook

Janice Austin presented the resolution for second reading and made a motion to approve. The motion was seconded, and the motion passed.

Commission on Graduate and Professional Student Affairs Resolution CGPSA 2022-23A

Resolution to Expand and Secure Access to Reproductive Care at Virginia Tech

Ben Beiter presented the resolution for second reading and made a motion to approve. The motion was seconded. Two letters of support for this resolution were received by the office of policy and governance and are attached. A vote was taken, and it was determined that there were more votes cast than there were voting

members in attendance. Because the initial vote was close, the attendance was confirmed offline, and the votes were recounted. The motion passed with 25 votes in favor of the resolution, 18 votes in opposition, and one abstention.

Commission on Graduate and Professional Studies and Policies

Resolution CGPSP 2022-23C

Resolution to Create the Department of Neurosurgery at VTC School of Medicine

Monty Abbas presented the resolution for first reading. This resolution will elevate the section of Neurosurgery in the Department of Surgery to become a standing department by itself. This is in response to the growth in terms of medical students, resident physicians, and other health professions students. It was indicated that it is common in medical schools for a surgery department to cleave off a department of neurosurgery once it has a critical mass. The neurosurgery department would have separate residency programs and a separate research agenda.

Resolution CGPSP 2022-23D

Resolution to Establish a Master of Professional Studies Degree in Climate Leadership

Monty Abbas presented the resolution for first reading. This resolution seeks to establish a professional master's degree in climate leadership. This degree will be administered online by the Center for Environmental Security. This program is aligning with the vision of Virginia Tech as it aims to prepare students to serve in leadership roles that are committed to helping communities respond to climate change.

Resolution CUSA 2022-23A

Resolution to Approve Revisions and Updates to the Virginia Tech Student Code of Conduct

Sanuri Shahed presented the resolution for first reading and introduced Nick Whitesell, Associate Director of Student Conduct, to provide information on the resolution. This resolution will provide several updates to the student code of conduct to be implemented in the 2023-24 academic year. There are several administrative changes along with more substantive policy changes and definition changes. The major changes include prohibiting anyone under the age of 21 from using tobacco (to align with current law); prohibiting climbing, rappelling, or scaling campus structures; prohibiting impersonation of another person with the intent of deceiving another person; clarifying the theft policy; and updating the definition of incapacitation.

Resolution CUSP 2022-23B

Resolution to Allow Administrative Resolution of First-Time Honor Code Cases

Evan Lavender-Smith presented the resolution for first reading. This resolution proposes changes to policy 6000 and the Virginia Tech Honor Code Manual to include the option for administrative resolution of academic misconduct cases when a student is referred to the Undergraduate Honors System for the first time or when a student is accepting responsibility for the violation but disputing the recommended sanctions.

I am writing to indicate my full **support for the GPSS Resolution to Expand Access to Reproductive Care**. This resolution concerns critical healthcare needs for women. In order for women to live their optimal lives and thrive in their families and communities, women must have access to <u>all</u> of the resources required to maintain their mental, physical and emotional well-being. A core component of this holistic health is Comprehensive Reproductive healthcare, which includes all of the educational, clinical and community service options for care and treatment of women.

Women deserve to be treated with dignity and respect. This includes being *fully informed* about and having *access to* all healthcare options available. Every woman has the right to select the best options for herself and her family including if and when to have children. I whole-heartedly support women having access to the most effective, timely, affordable (low-or-no cost), and safe, birth control and family planning methods through the health clinic Access to mifepristone and misoprostol (the abortion pills) and other reproductive health services are essential to support all women's personal rights and self-determination.

The most esteemed experts in women's health, the American Congress of Obstetrics and Gynecologists (ACOG) states:

All women should have unhindered and affordable access to all U.S. Food and Drug Administration-approved contraceptives.

In support of all women's rights, Cornelia Ramsey Deagle, PHD, MSPH I'm a concerned community member, parent, and abortion access supporter writing to express my support for the GPSS resolution to expand and secure access to reproductive care at Virginia Tech, specifically for on campus access to mifepristone and misoprostol.

Access to healthcare, and specifically reproductive care, can be costly and time-consuming for students, and anything that can be done to make access easier and more affordable should be done. The current closest in-person clinics offering appointments specifically for prescribing the mifepristone and misoprostol protocol are 45 minutes away in Roanoke. While these medications can be prescribed by telehealth appointments in Virginia currently, there are a limited number of clinics who can provide these appointments, and expanding that number moves us closer to timely, safe access to medication abortions for those who need them.
