Committee Reports

Graduate Curriculum Committee

Graduate School Update

The BOV heard Ryan King's constituency report and discussed stipend levels and food insecurity. Other constituency reports included physical accessibility. All four constituency groups raised questions about the need to improve communication university-wide. The Academic, Research, and Student Affairs Committee heard a panel on inclusion and diversity. Walter Lee, assistant professor in engineering education, discussed how the diversity and inclusion requirement is being instituted in the department. Dr. DePauw thanked Mr. Mantha and Ms. Cortney Steele for their action on food insecurity. A member of the BOV is making a significant contribution to the university and will assist in the food insecurity initiative. The gift will be announced January 1st. The first meeting of the site alignment process was held yesterday. Dr. DePauw will travel to the metro Washington area in January and February and share additional information on programs as they relate to site alignment. The innovation campus courses will be taught at the Northern Virginia Center in 2020.

There were two notifications of academic changes. The Construction Management Certificate was approved on October 24th. The B.S. in Engineering, Science, and Mechanics was officially discontinued.
