Commission on Graduate Studies and Policies

Resolution 2014-15C

Resolution to Establish the Master of Arts Degree in Data Analysis and Applied Statistics

Dr. Hans Robinson presented the resolution for first reading.

This new degree will be directed primarily at students whose home department is not in statistics, but make extensive use of statistical techniques and methods in their research. This degree will be a way for these students to take classes from the Department of Statistics and document their competency. A question was raised as to why this new degree is a Master of Arts instead of a Master of Science degree. Dr. Eric Smith indicated that there is currently a Master of Science degree in Statistics which has a more theoretical component to it, and the new Master of Arts degree being proposed focuses more on applications. The new degree will be exam based and not thesis based.

Resolution to Approve New Major, Criminology in the Bachelor of Science in Sociology

Resolution to Approve New Degree in Bachelor of Science in Systems Biology

Dr. Stephen Martin presented the resolution for first reading. It is one of several new interdisciplinary degrees coming through the College of Science. This new degree will be able to leverage a lot of existing resources in this area such as VBI and the Fralin Life Science Institute. This will allow an undergraduate degree in this area. This degree will be housed in the Academy of Integrated Science. Other degrees in the academy include nanoscience, neuroscience, and computational modeling and data analytics. The academy provides a structure for student advising.

6. Discussion

Benefits for Same-Sex Married Couples - President Sands called on Dr. Hal Irvin to comment on today's action by the U.S. Supreme Court and its effect on Virginia Tech employees. Dr. Irvin explained that the decision of the U.S. Supreme Court to decline to review the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals' ruling in *Bostic v. Schaefer* means same-sex marriage is now legal in the Commonwealth of Virginia. The university is awaiting guidance from the Virginia Department of Human Resource Management regarding the process for same-sex married couples to apply for benefits. There is no effect for employees who have domestic partners; domestic partners remain ineligible for benefits. Dr. DePauw noted, however, that the Supreme Court's action has no effect on graduate students receiving assistantships because the private company providing their health insurance already allowed them to insure domestic partners. Dr. Sands indicated that the Supreme Court's action will now enable Virginia Tech to recruit those who are directly affected by the court's action.
